

Recipients of the EAPR support will be required to write a short report about their participation in the EAPR2020 conference by 31st July 2021. Expenses will be reimbursed after the Conference on the basis of the report, proof of payment and invoices.

2021 EAPR COUNCIL MEETING

The EAPR Council meeting took place online on 21st January 2021. The meeting started, inevitably, with a discussion on the timing of the Triennial Conference. As mass vacinnations are helping to control the spread of COVID-19, we remain optimistic that the conference can take place in Kraków 12-16 July this year and we look forward to receiving abstracts and registrations by the deadlines (see page 2). Over 130 abstracts have already been received! A decision was also made that future Triannials would be held in 2024 (Norway) and 2027 (to be determined).

Besides the Triennial, a number of legal matters were discussed including the need for insurance, the timing of general assembly meetings and changes to some of our bylaws to reflext new rule changes. A new agreement with ISHS has also been reached to reduce payments to them for their membership services, which is reflective of the new online membership and payment systems set up by the Association through our new website. As our finances are looking quite healthy this year, we have put aside money for both the Triennial and Section meetings to help students to attend (so please look out for this when registering).

Our journal Potato Research is looking healthier than ever with 36 papers accepted in 2020. To help to maintain this effort, new and enthusiastic editors are always welcome, as are more papers on phytopathology, which is lacking compared to other areas.

In terms of Section meetings, it is very unlikley that any will take place this year but some have been planned for 2022 and others are likely to also happen then, so look out for more information on these and check our website regularly.

Most papers published are within the area of agro-physiology, utilisation and breeding. We could use many more papers on phytopathology.

We are currently in the process of rejuvenating our team of processing editors. Many prominent potato experts have served Potato Research in an excellent way for many years but have indicated that they have passed retirement age


